When a horse exercises, it sweats. When the horse sweats, it loses electrolytes. When electrolytes in a horse's body are depleted, its performance and general well-being are in jeopardy. The work load, fitness of the horse and environmental influences all can have an impact on the amount a horse sweats.

WHAT ARE ELECTROLYTES?

- -Electrolytes are positively or negatively charged particles that have the ability to conduct electricity.
- -The electrolyte minerals include sodium, chloride, potassium, magnesium and calcium.
- -Horses, like humans rely on these minerals (electrolytes) to maintain fluid balance and circulatory function, facilitate muscle contractions, trigger nerve functions and maintain the body's acid-base balance

IS ELECTROLYTE SUPPLEMENATION REALLY NECESSARY?

- -Small quantities of electrolytes are lost from a horse's body on a daily bases in urine and faeces and are usually replaced by the diet.
- -However, what makes the horse unique is that during exercise, sodium, potassium and chloride and smaller quantities of magnesium and calcium are lost from a horse's body in sweat. The horse is unable to store a reservoir of these, thus generally making some form of supplementation necessary.

Electrolyte deficiencies are associated with a large number of problems-including:

- « Fatigue « Muscle Weakness « Lethargy
- « Reduced Feed & Water Intakes « Weight Loss « Dehydration
- « Hyperthermia (over-heating) « Recurring Bouts of Tying-Up

HOW DO I SELECT A SUITABLE ELECTROLYTE SUPPLEMENT?

Buy smart; be wary of products that contain less than 800 grams per kg of actual electrolytes. Some of the most popular products on the market are more than 50%

'filler' (usually dextrose or glucose) - which is of little benefit to the horse as part of an electrolyte replacement program (glucose should make up less than 10% of an electrolytes composition to assist in effective absorption of sodium).

An example of a well formulated electrolyte is Kelato's KelatoLYTE- it contains 880 grams of actual electrolytes per kilogram and its is only 9.2% glucose.

Regular grooming can assist with access hair during summer. Familiarise yourself with the symptoms of heat stress and hypothermia in cats. Quick action can save their lives!

Fly In for Fly protection.....continued

Biting flies, nuisance flies, lice and bots can cause damage and irritation to horses. Biting flies tend to draw more attention because of the irritations and infections they can cause.

- -Stable flies and horse flies (females) feed on blood, particularly from any warm blooded animal (horses, humans, pets, livestock)
- -Peaks of feeding activity commonly occur during early morning and late afternoon.
- -Prefer feeding on lower parts of the host.
- -Can inflict painful bites and present major problems for horses grazing near streams or low, wet areas.
- -Horse flies have been incriminated in the transmission of equine infectious anemia.

Prevention

- -Sanitation around stables or yards to reduce larval development
- -Spreading of manure in paddocks promotes drying and prevents larvae from developing
- -Keeping horses stabled during peak sessions
- -rugging horses and the use of fly veils can be helpful

-application of insecticidal and or repellent sprays to control flies to both horse and housing.















Most Insecticidal sprays will assist in the control of biting and nuisance flies on Horses, Dogs, Cattle and Pigs. Some will also control fleas and lice on Dogs and Cats. The sprays that assist with sand-fly and midge control will assist with symptoms of QLD Itch.

Concentrated rinses are good value for money and will also assist in the control of biting and nuisance flies and biting insects associated with QLD itch. Some products will also do tick control on both Horses and Dogs however not effective for Paralysis tick.

Did you know? Apple Cider Vinegar is a natural fly repellent? One of the benefits of feeding your horse apple cider vinegar is to make the horse less attractive to flies and insects. Some specialists believe that horses sweat the vinegar out so that it becomes a natural horse fly spray.

HEARTWORM IN DOGS

Is your dog protected against heartworm? There are now so many effective and easy solutions to so many canine diseases, that it can be easy to lose track of what is being treated and what is being missed. It is very important to remember that the worms that live in the intestine [gut] and heartworm are very different worms and although some products treat both, most intestinal wormers do not treat heartworm.

Heartworms and Intestinal worms [roundworms, hookworms, tapeworms] are different!

Here are some important points:

Heartworm is carried by mosquitoes, so it is everywhere, even if your dog does not mix with other dogs

Heartworm must be prevented whenever possible. It can be treated, but this is extremely expensive and very bad for your dog. Intestinal worms can be treated easily.

The only way to know if your dog has heartworm is to get a blood test from a vet. By the time your dog is showing signs of heartworm disease [heart failure], it is almost too late to treat.

You should never start heartworm prevention without first checking with

your vet, as giving preventatives to an infected dog could be fatal.

Once started, treat all year round. Do not stop in winter [the mosquitoes don't stop in winter so neither do the heartworms]

The Key to Success!

The key to success is to plan pasture programs well. This is essential if you want to consistently establish good pastures. The most important factors are-

- -Adequate Soil Moisture— Always aim to sow on good subsoil moisture. Rain following sowing is critical.
- -Effective Weed Control– Weed competition is a major cause of failure.
- -Good Seed Quality/treatment
- -Shallow Sowing Depth– Aim to sow less than 1.5cm deep, especially with Rhodes grass.
- -Adequate Soil Fertility

Rhodes Grass

- -Widely adapted depending on variety
- -Particularly suited to sandy & sandy loam soils
- -Moderate tolerance of salinity & acidity
- -Easily established
- -available in Pioneer, Katambora, Nemkat & Callide.

Guidelines for Establishing Pastures

- -Select paddocks early and plan especially to reduce weed competition through until pasture is established.
- -Reduce weed problems through the cropping phase.
- -Sow on good subsoil moisture.
- -Sow shallow (aim at 1.5cm)
- -Use press wheels or a roller (not on crusting soils)
- -Check fertiliser needs
- -Sow when there is the greatest chance of follow up rain for your area.
- -Sow annual legumes with a crop or introduce the following year.
- -Monitor weeds and pests and control if necessary.
- -Preferably do not graze until plants have seeded.
